

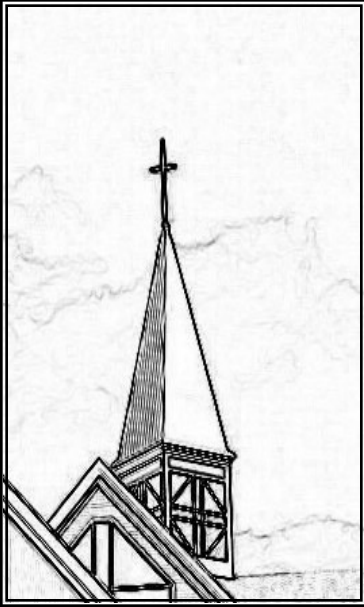

Homecoming...

October 2009



The tradition of the local church homecoming is a feature of fall celebrations in long-established rural southern churches. In some places, the homecoming is a kick-off for an annual series of fall "Revival" meetings. In almost every church a "Dinner on the Grounds" is a staple. I've served churches that had their own cemeteries in which members, young and old, would take time before and after the service to wander among the gravestones looking at names and remembering the saints. I know of churches that set up their picnic tables between the church and its cemetery as a silent reminder that one day all saints will be caught up together once again in the presence of Christ.

Homecomings may coincide closely with a church anniversary (perhaps the founding of the church), or a commemoration of a significant event in the life and history of the church. A long-established church whose members and children have scattered may have annual homecomings. Newer churches like our own celebrate major anniversaries (this is the 20th year since Seaside was founded). But central to the idea of the homecoming is the return of former members from far and near, many of whom make annual pilgrimages to the church of their childhood to participate.

I am often struck by the reactions of those who return after a long absence. Not long after we arrived, a couple dropped by the church on their way through the area. They explained that they joined Seaside in 1990 or 1991, were here for several years, and then moved away. This was their first time back in many years and they were astounded by what they saw and all that was going on.

Who would have imagined where Seaside would be when those first families gathered in a furniture store back in 1989. In that span, children have grown up, others have grown old and some have died. And many have come to be a part of this special place, this "Sanctuary by the Sea." Our Homecoming is October 4th. Won't you join us on that special Sunday at 10:00AM (one service) as we remember our first 20 years together and look forward to the decades ahead?

Have You Ever Been the “New Kid” on the Block?

Have you ever been the “new kid on the block?” Do you remember what it felt like to walk into a new environment where you didn’t know anyone? Were you ignored, treated with hostility, or did someone extend the hand of inclusion to you? My guess is that at some point in our lives, probably several, we have each experienced being the new one or the “outsider.” Seaside is new to a lot of people who come through our doors. And even though some of us have been members or regular attendees for a while, there are times, due to the size of our church and the three services that we may still find ourselves in a position of feeling “new” or like an “outsider.”

We don’t want anyone to ever feel that way because if you remember, it feels mighty uncomfortable. That is why we are developing a program called “Fellowship Friends.” Right now we are calling it a program but it is really a process—a process of extending friendship and inclusiveness to all. After all, we want to be an open, accepting, loving community of Christ. We want to be “the church” as Christ intended us to be.

We had a small trial over the summer where we matched a couple of new members with “old” members to help the newbies learn more about our church and we received positive feedback. Now we want to extend an invitation to all who are interested in learning more to join us on Monday 10/26 at 3:30PM in room 210 to talk about being friendlier and more inclusive. Some people are just naturally outgoing—and several spring immediately to mind—but others need some coaching so that is why we want to have this session. We are going to cover several topics, such as why acknowledging others is so important; suggested opening “lines” to greet others; review of opportunities for which to extend an invitation of inclusion; identification of roving “ambassadors,” etc. And because this is a process, not a program, it will not require extra precious time or add to our “busyness” because it takes place while we are at church.

And remember, sometimes we are so friendly to each other that we don’t see the “new kid on the block” or the person we don’t recognize who normally attends another service, just standing there . . . So even if you can’t come on the 26th, please be aware of those within ten feet of you and include them in your circle. If you are one who always greets and includes others, please come to share your successes. 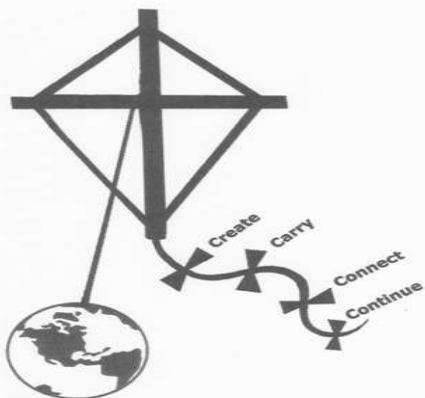
NCCUMW Annual Meeting, Oct 10
