# Seaside Currents

## A Story of Two Horses



This week I read a beautiful story by Sherry Niese of two horses who live together in a pasture. From a distance they look like any other horses. But as you take a closer look, you will notice something amazing: one horse is blind. Next you will notice that the sighted horse, a smaller horse, is wearing a small bell on its halter. The bell allows the blind friend to sense where the other horse is located, so that he can follow.

As you stand and observe these two horses, you will see that the horse with the bell is constantly checking on the blind horse. The blind horse is constantly listening for the bell, then slowly moving toward the other horse. It is as if the blind horse knows he will not be led astray. Each evening, when the horse with the bell returns to the barn, it will stop occasionally and look back to make sure that the blind horse is not too far behind, and can still hear the bell.

This story is amazing on several levels. First, it is amazing that the owners of these two horses have allowed the blind horse to live, and have found a way to assist it in living peacefully. Like these horse owners, God does not throw us away just because we have imperfections, limitations or challenges. Also amazingly, God continues to watch over us, and even brings others into our lives to assist us, to help make our lives better. We are not alone in this world. God places persons into our lives to guide us and strengthen us.

There are times in our lives when we are like the blind horse, and need the guidance of the ringing bell of another to help us find our way. God gives us those bell-ringing people to show us the path to go. And at other times, we are called to be the guide horse, one that can ring the bell and help others to find their way. Sometimes we may not even recognize that we are being helped, or that we are mentoring another along their journey. These are miracles of God at work in our lives.

It is a means of God's grace that we are given one another to strengthen and guide each other day by day. While we may not always recognize God's helping hand, it is always there. We are called to listen for each other's bell, and help each other along our Christian walk.

Each of us is struggling with some challenge or struggle, even those who seem to be the strongest, the toughest, the most faithful. So let's remember to be helpful, kind and generous to one another in all circumstances.

**"Christianity and World Religions: Wrestling With Questions People Ask"** is a video-based small-group study and outreach program written by Adam Hamilton of the United Methodist Church of the Resurrection in Kansas City. This study explores four major world religions—Hinduism, Buddhism, Islam, and Judaism—and compares the beliefs of each with those of Christianity. This six-week study deals openly and honestly with questions people ask about other religions, including why we should believe the claims of Christianity over those of other faiths. As part of the study, author and presenter Adam Hamilton interviews a religious leader from each tradition. He treats the world religions with great respect, recognizing the unique contributions of each.

In examining these major world religions and the beliefs of their followers, the Reverend Hamilton urges us as Christians to build bridges with others so that we might grow in our faith, seek peace in our world, love our neighbor, and find positive ways to share the gospel.

### Getting To Know Daniel Wray

Daniel was born on August 16, 1987 in Richmond Virginia. His parents are Carol and Wayne Wray and he has an older sister, Lauren. His mom is a special education teacher for a high school in Chesterfield, VA, which is right outside of Richmond. His dad just started working at Haverty's, previously he worked as a warehouse manager in a small local company in Virginia. His sister just received her Bachelor's degree in social work from Virginia Commonwealth University and will receive her Masters of Social Work next year. His grandfather, James Higgins, was a United Methodist minister in the Virginia Conference and was a very big influence on his decision to become a minister.

He attended Randolph-Macon College, a small liberal arts college in Ashland, VA. There he received a Bachelor's of Arts in Psychology, Religious Studies, and Philosophy. Along with his studies he worked as an assistant youth director at Duncan Memorial UMC in Ashland, VA.

He just completed his first of three years at Duke Divinity School. Many people have asked how he came to be an intern at Seaside, and it was through a Field Education program. The program, with help from Duke Endowment and other funding associations, sends over 200 seminary students to churches and agencies throughout the United States, and overseas as well.

Many people want to know what he has done or will do as an intern at Seaside. He is working with the youth group, as well as leading a Men's Bible Study. He has visited people in the hospitals as well as participated with groups and committees that help plan and implement many of the ministries here at Seaside. He has participated in the worship services and will have opportunities to preach throughout the summer. The best part of having so many different types of activities to be involved in is not only the experience he is gaining, but also the chance to get to know more people in the church.

Some of his interests outside of church include sports, especially baseball. In fact, one of his goals in life is to travel to every MLB stadium. He has already been to thirteen stadiums and may have a chance to go to the one in Seattle in August. He also enjoys listening to music, but one of his favorite things to do is to travel, to see new places—both the big cities and the more rural settings where you can find beautiful natural wonders.

## Extending a Welcoming Hand



Doesn't it make you feel good when someone you may or may not know greets you with a welcoming smile? As we grow as a church family, we have recognized the need to be more intentional about our greetings of others and we have been encouraging all to participate in welcoming everyone at church, not just at the door, or at the welcome desk, or in the service. Many folks have mentioned that it is *out of their comfort zone* to talk to strangers but they have tried it and feel good about the results. So we asked some of those who initially expressed some discomfort: Lois Russell, Jim McNeil, Pat Burke, Nancy Seibert, and our greeter role model, Lomie Lou Bazemore, a couple of questions and here are some tips:

Tell them you are happy they are at Seaside and perhaps compliment them on their jewelry, their shirt, etc.; introduce yourself and say you don't think we've met; ask where they live or where they come from. All of these comments or questions elicit a positive response such as a warm smile and conversation starters. Areas of commonality have been found such as coming from the same area or living in the same development or having some with the same interests. Others have enjoyed meeting members they didn't know, or people who visit the area and always come to Seaside because they love the church community.

Lomie Lou closes her conversations with, "Look for me next week when you come back," so they know they will have a fellowship friend greeting them.

Since the responses are so positive, our *out-of-our-comfort zone* greeters are getting very comfortable in this new habit—and as one said, "It becomes a natural habit." Another said, "It spills over into other areas of our lives and we *can* end up having interesting conversations with strangers."

We know from feedback that most people come to a church because someone has invited them and we know Lomie Lou has been doing that for years, so let's all reinforce the efforts of those who are extending the invitation.

Try it – you'll like it!
