The start of a new pastoral appointment coincided with the church's appeal to help victims of a hurricane. All this information was relayed via the congregation's bulletin. Unfortunately, the center page of the church bulletin was accidentally omitted that day. So when the members read from the bottom of the second page to the top of the last page, this is what they read:

"Welcome to the Rev. Andrew Jensen and his family ... the worst disaster to hit the area in this century. The full extent of the tragedy is not yet known."

(Thanks to Kim and Carolyn Loucks for sharing this with me.)

What a way to welcome a new clergy family!

But have you ever felt like you've been "omitted?" Left out? Left behind? Devalued? You probably have—I know I have felt that way. I have never been athletic, so I was among the last chosen for sports activities in gym or recess growing up. In my first two appointments, my salary was cut (prior to my arrival, and unbeknownst to me) because the congregation was "having to take a woman" pastor. It's bad enough to have had it happen once, but *twice*? There are times when we all say to God, "Oh come on... is this some kind of cruel joke?"

And then there are times when physical or mental infirmities hold us back. Frequently at Seaside someone is in a leg or arm cast, a shoulder or foot brace, on crutches or in a wheelchair. As in all of life, some folks see this as the glass half empty, while others see the glass half full. What a blessing it is that we have wonderful doctors who can mend us, crutches to hold us up, and wheelchairs and motorized chairs to move us down the road. It's important to have something strong to lean on.

And so it is with our inner spirits. There are times when we are strong inside and can assist others in standing tall. At other times, we are weak and need the help of others we can depend upon. But it is important to work toward making sure the crutches of our lives are only temporary. It would be easy for us to continue to rely upon another person to keep us strong. For some, an addiction is their crutch. Some folks feel such a need to care for others they will actually work toward keeping another person down without realizing they are doing this.

In emotionally dysfunctional homes, one spouse will work to make the other spouse dependent by isolation from family and friends, by making all the important decisions, and by criticisms and constant unrest in the household. Over the years, the dependent spouse loses the ability to make decisions independently. Even the abilities to self-assess feelings and make plans for the future are lost. If we become too accustomed to being supported by another person, we might never be able to walk alone.

Hopefully the time comes when we are able to shake off that which has slowed us down, whether a cast, a crutch, a brace or a person. While we will still want the support of others in our lives, it is good to know that we can feel strong again in our Christian faith and stand tall without others having to hold us up. May God help us to keep our lives in balance and centered on the Spirit who makes us strong and courageous, who guides, comforts and leads us forward.

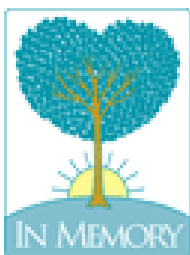

Stephen Ministry & Life's Jagged Lines

A Catholic Church in Tucson, Our Mother of Sorrows Parish, states their successful years of participation in Stephen Ministry is about responding to the jagged lines in a person's life. The jagged line can be

any one of the worst experiences of life. Death of a child, bitter divorce, devastating disease, drug addiction, loneliness, and the list goes on and on. For them, responding to those jagged lines is what Christ's healing love is all about. Msgr. Cahalane brought the ministry to the parish in 1989. He believed Stephen Ministry is a gift within their parish community, a gift of compassionate outreach to those who are experiencing painful transition in their lives.

Dorothy Root, a church member and a Stephen Minister, says she learned to care in a supportive way. She also learned that Stephen Ministry is not about preaching to a person in crisis. Her training made it clear that as a Stephen Minister she was not a professional counselor, psychologist or social worker. Dorothy says, "it is ultimately about being there." Her experience has taught her it may not even be about praying with a person in crisis unless they want to pray. In the years that have passed at our Lady of Sorrows, more than 150 parishioners have been trained in Stephen Ministry and countless parishioners have received the benefit of that training.

Sister Jeanette Mariani, who was director of Pastoral Care and Stephen Ministry, stated Jesus was empathetic. And their goal at Our Mother of Sorrows is "empathetic companionship in a relationship that has Christ in the middle, joining the two edges and healing the jagged line."

October is pink Breast Cancer Awareness Month

Hi everyone . . . Well, fall is here and now the quiet, laid-back, “hot” summertime is behind us and we move forward into a busy, hectic, fast-paced time of the year. A “new” season...and for me, a “new” job. I’d like to introduce myself to all of you. If you don’t already know me from working as the secretary here for the past 3-1/2 years, I’m Carol Sigafoos and my “new” job title is Director of Health & Wellness. My office has moved from one end of the hall down to the other end...but that’s not all that’s changed! There’s so much to learn about and so many programs to educate myself on that I sometimes feel like my head is spinning! Actually, I’m very excited and thrilled to be part of this ministry that touches so many of our church families. I already know a lot of you but there are some I’m not as familiar with, so please feel free to stop by my office and introduce yourself or give me a call just to say, “Hi.” My schedule can vary as I’m in and out of the office, but is basically from 9 to 5 on Tuesday, Wednesday & Thursday, and of course on Sunday mornings. I’d like to thank everyone who sent cards and emails wishing me well in my new position, and especially to all those who are keeping me in their prayers! Please continue to do so, as I will you....

Blood Pressure checks are the second Sunday of the month unless otherwise announced.

The month of October is BREAST CANCER AWARENESS MONTH. Every 2.5 minutes, a new case of breast cancer is diagnosed. Digital mammography is one of the best tools available for use to help in early detection. This is a painless procedure—regardless of what you’ve heard, and worth the time it takes for an appointment. The American Cancer Society says that women should have mammograms starting at age 40 and every year afterwards. Be sure to wear your THINK PINK ribbon during October to support the cause! Chances are, we’ve all been touched somehow by this horrific disease and we *know* that a cure is on the way!

Risk factors for breast cancer include:

Age and gender—risk increases as you age.
Women are 100 times more likely to get breast cancer than men.

Family history of breast cancer

Genes—most common being BRCA1 and BRCA2 genes.

Menstrual cycle—women who menstruated before age 12 or went through menopause after age 55.

Alcohol use—more than 1-2 glasses a day

Childbirth—never had children or had them after age 30.

DES—taken to prevent miscarriages

HRT—hormone replacement therapy for several years.

Radiation as a child or young adult for cancer of the chest area.

Early breast cancer usually doesn’t cause symptoms, which is why regular breast exams are important. Symptoms vary widely and may include:

Lumps—on the breast or in the armpit that are hard with uneven edges and usually do not hurt.

Change in size, shape or feel of the breast or nipple.

Redness, puckering or dimpling.

Fluid coming from the nipple.

Remember...Men get breast cancer too! Symptoms include breast lump and breast pain and tenderness. The earlier breast cancer is found and diagnosed, the better your chances of beating it.
