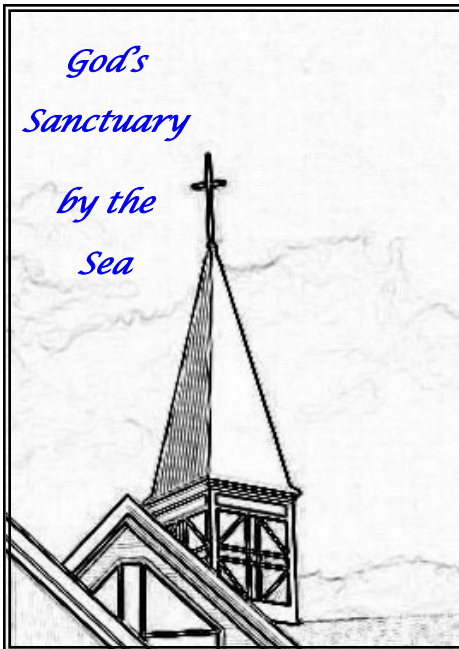

Country Fair

The County Fair has had a great beginning for 2013. We have sold three lawn mowers for \$2500 and the BBQ dinner brought in over \$2100. Donations continue to come in, but we are in great need of auction items. This is our largest moneymaker and so far we do not have any large items to sell. Please keep us in mind if you have a car or boat that you would consider donating.

Our first event will be September 14th. Greg Rowles, from the Alabama Theatre, will present an outdoor kick-off concert on the grounds of the church. The show will begin at 4PM with a performance by the children's choir. Next, Greg, along with friends from the Theatre, will present a program of many favorite Country and Gospel songs. Our theme, in keeping with our event, is an old-fashioned country hoedown and will feature many favorite Country

and Gospel songs. Our theme, in keeping with our event, is an old-fashioned country hoedown and will feature only entertainment this year. The concert will also be free to everyone. We are going faith-based this year and will take up a love offering to help cover the costs of the concert. We will also be selling hot dogs, drinks, chips and snacks. So wear your bandanas, jeans, and straw hats and bring your chairs or blankets and join us for a couple of hours of entertainment, fellowship and food. Should it rain, we will hold the concert indoors.

There are many items that we could use if you haven't made all of your donations yet. A freezer is needed to hold our baked goods. Then, the freezer will be sold at the live auction on Saturday. Garden and yard sale items, as well as books are still needed. The silent auction can use donations of services (such as: cleaning, cooking or catering meals, maintenance, painting, yard work, etc.), as well as beach rentals, antiques, artwork, or other items of value that you will be willing to donate. Jewelry will need your items ASAP in order for Colleen to clean or repair them before the Fair. Remember to donate your broken or unwanted gold jewelry, as last year Colleen received over \$3000 for the gold. The last date to turn in all donations (with the exception of jewelry) is September 1st, so please look through your garages and closets and find all the things that you want to give to the Country Fair. Call the church office for pick-ups.

Remember the Fair dates are September 20th & 21st—(rain dates are 27th and 28th). We start each day at 7AM. On Friday we will have our dinner at 5PM. We will close at 1PM on Saturday. The Children's activity area will be open on Friday from 4-7PM and on Saturday from 8AM-12PM. All activities are free for the children, and will be well supervised.

During Fair week, we will need help with set-up and moving. Tuesday is tent, table and chair set-up. Wednesday we move garden, books, clothing and yard sale. Thursday we will move live auction items. Please consider helping with your time and trucks. The sign up sheets are still posted at the church for all the events that still need workers.

We thank each of you that have helped or donated this year. We ask all of you to keep us in your prayers so that the event will be safe and successful.

Country Fair

The Health & Wellness Committee will be performing blood pressure checks at the Country Fair again this year. There will also be first aid stations both outside and inside the church. If anyone is interested in helping out in these areas, please sign up on the board outside the kitchen under Health & Wellness. Melanoma/Skin Cancer

Skin cancers include melanoma, basal cell, and squamous cell. Basal and squamous cell are common and treatment is very effective; malignant melanoma, especially in later stages, is serious and can be difficult to treat. Sun exposure is the biggest cause of melanoma and other skin cancers. Early diagnosis and treatment can increase the survival rate from melanoma. Learn about the signs of all skin cancers, and familiarize yourself with pictures of skin cancer so you can spot it early.

Early signs

The most important warning sign for melanoma is **any change** in size, shape, or color of a mole or other skin growth, such as a birthmark. Watch for changes that occur over a period of weeks to a month. Use the ABCDE rule to evaluate skin

and call your health professional if you have any of the following changes:

A is for asymmetry. One half of the mole or skin growth doesn't match the other half.

B is for border irregularity. The edges are ragged, notched, or blurred.

C is for color. The pigmentation is not uniform. Shades of tan, brown, and black are present. Dashes of red, white, and blue add to the mottled appearance. Changes in color distribution, especially the spread of color from the edge of a mole into the surrounding skin.

D is for diameter. The mole or skin growth is larger than 6 mm (0.25 in.) or about the size of a pencil eraser. Any growth of a mole should be of concern.

E is for evolution. There is a change in the size, shape, color, surface, or symptoms (such as itching or tenderness, especially bleeding) of a mole.

Melanoma can develop in an existing mole or other mark on the skin, but it often develops in unmarked skin. Although melanoma can grow anywhere on the body, it often occurs on the upper back of men and women and on the legs in women. Less often, it can grow on the soles, palms, nail beds, or mucous membranes that line body cavities. On older people, the face is the most common place for melanoma to grow. And in older men, the most common sites are the neck, scalp, and ears. Many other skin conditions (such as seborrheic keratosis, warts, and basal cell cancer) have features similar to those of melanoma.

Later symptoms

Later signs of melanoma include:

A break in the skin or bleeding from a mole or other colored skin lesion.

Pain in a mole or lesion.

Early Detection

Skin self-exam is a good way to detect early skin changes that may point to melanoma. A skin self-exam is used to find suspicious growths that may be cancer or growths that may develop into skin cancer (precancers). Adults should examine their skin once every month. Look for any abnormal skin growth or any change in the color, shape, size, or appearance of a skin growth. Check for any area of injured skin (lesion) that does not heal. Have your spouse or someone such as a close friend help you monitor your skin, especially places that are hard to see such as your scalp and back.

There are other steps you can take to prevent skin cancer or detect it at an early stage.

Be aware of the risk of skin cancer and the steps you can take to prevent it, including staying out of the midday sun, wearing protective clothing, and using sunscreen on exposed skin.

Have your doctor examine any suspicious skin changes.

He or she may check your skin once a year.

Surgical removal (excision) of the affected skin is the most effective treatment for skin cancer. If it's melanoma, excision, which involves removing the entire melanoma along with a border (margin) of normal-appearing skin, is the standard course. More treatment may be needed based on the stage of the melanoma.

Melanoma may be cured if caught and treated in its early stages when it affects only the skin

Meal Preparation

We're looking for volunteers who are willing to prepare a small meal, when someone needs help. The need could be due to surgery or illness, or during their recovery time. It could also be because someone is going through a stressful situation or crisis and just needs some temporary help. These are times your church family wants and needs to be there for you.

If you feel this is a ministry you'd like to be part of and can prepare a small meal or make an extra serving when preparing your own meal, please call Carol Sigafos at the church office or email her at:

csigafos@seasideumc.org and we'll put you on the "call" list. We'll contact the people on the list as needed. You will be given details at the time of the call as to allergies, likes and dislikes, number of people, where to drop off the meal, etc. These situations are not planned and we have no way of knowing when meals are needed, but if you're not available at that time, we'll try again in the future. It doesn't mean you are obligated, only **willing** to help when and if you can. What a wonderful way to show Christ's love, by sharing what you have with others! Thanks in advance and God Bless you all!
