### **Where Did Summer Go?**

It's difficult to believe that by the time you read this, September will be here and summer will be over. Many of the tourists have gone home, and the children are all back in school.

Seaside Teaching and Reaching Students, or STARS, had another successful season. Sixteen of our students earned iPads for reaching or exceeding their DIBELS goals and perfect parental involvement for the six weeks. If you missed the closing graduation of students, you missed a real treat and a wonderful blessing. The children sang, and then each read a brief piece highlighting one of their favorite activities. All the students are set for a better school year because of the dedication of all our STARS staff and the 75 volunteers from our church and community.

While we might like to rest now and consider our task complete for the year, there is much more that we need to do. State budget cuts are hurting our area classrooms. Many of the teachers have no adult assistants or even volunteer helpers. The children still need our help. We can volunteer to come into the classrooms and read or assist in other ways in the classroom. You really don't need special training to read to a child or to be a friendly face in a child's life.

While our biological families may be far away, we can build an extended family right here with these children who so desperately need us. It only takes a little bit of your time. One of the STARS teachers shared with me that in her classroom last year she had one volunteer who came in for one hour a week. She had no other classroom help.

That's why I've decided I'm going to volunteer at Jessie Mae Monroe Elementary School this year. Would you pray about and consider whether God might be leading you to help as well? You may want to volunteer at Union Elementary or Waccamaw Elementary School instead. We at Seaside are blessed to have volunteers working in all three schools. I applaud your commitment, my friends!

In the near future, folks from the Harbor District will be coming to Seaside Church to recognize our congregation for its work with STARS. Other congregations are beginning to connect with Meg Good, STARS director, to find out how they might replicate STARS in their community. Our program is seen as a model across the annual conference. While we celebrate these successes and all the possibilities for our conference to assist children, we know there is still much yet to be done right here at home.

So many of us cherish times with children. There are children in our midst who need us now. I pray that you will answer the call to servant leadership. And, as always, I hope to see you in your place this Sunday morning, as together we continue to hear God's call to ministry for each and every one of us.
